<p><i>The Story of Jesus - The Anointed One (Christ)</i></p> <p><b>Matthew</b> - for the Jews.  <b>Mark</b> - for the Romans.  <b>Luke</b> - for the Greeks.  <b>John</b> - for the world.</p>	<p><i>The Birth &amp; Growth of The Church</i></p> <p><b>Acts</b> – History shared by an eyewitness (Luke).  <b>Colossians, I &amp; II Corinthians, Ephesians, Galatians, Philippians, Romans, and I &amp; II Thessalonians</b> – Paul’s letters to the churches he established and/or encouraged.  <b>Philemon, I &amp; II Timothy, and Titus</b> – Paul’s letters to individuals.  <b>Hebrews, James, I, II &amp; III John, Jude, and I &amp; II Peter</b> – Teaching and guidance from Church leaders.</p>	<p><i>The Revelation of Christ &amp; The New Kingdom</i></p> <p><b>Revelation</b> – Vision given to John while he was exiled on the Isle of Patmos.</p>
